SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR FUNERAL LITURGIES

The scripture readings listed here are those provided in the Order of Christian Funerals. The single line with each reading is intended to summarize one thought from each reading. Rather than depend on these summary lines, it would be best to read fully each suggested text. The single line with the Responsorial Psalm is what the community sings after each verse of the psalm.

Old Testament Readings

Job 19:23-27a I know that my Redeemer lives. **Wisdom 3:1-9** He accepted them as a holocaust. Wisdom 4:7-15 A blameless life is a ripe old age. Isaiah 25:6-9 The Lord God will destroy death forever.
